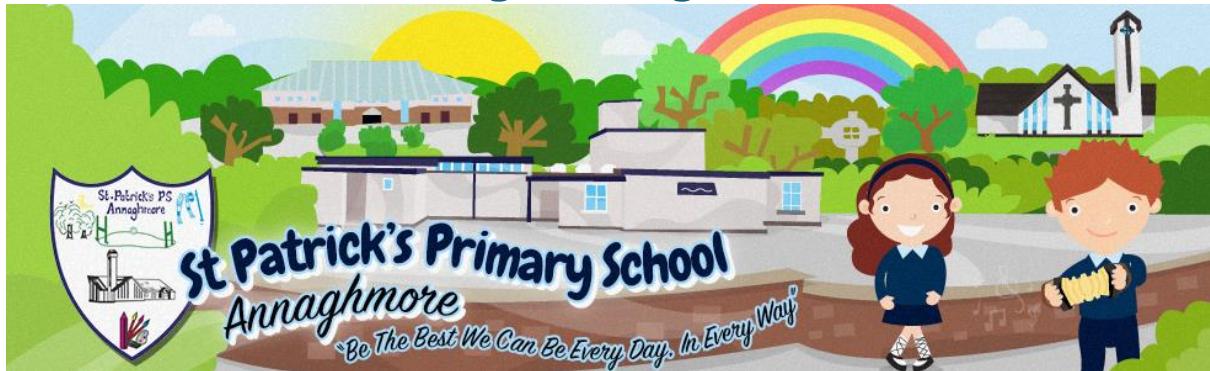

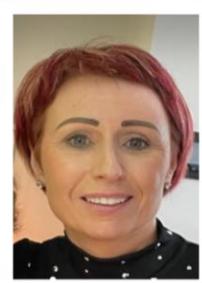

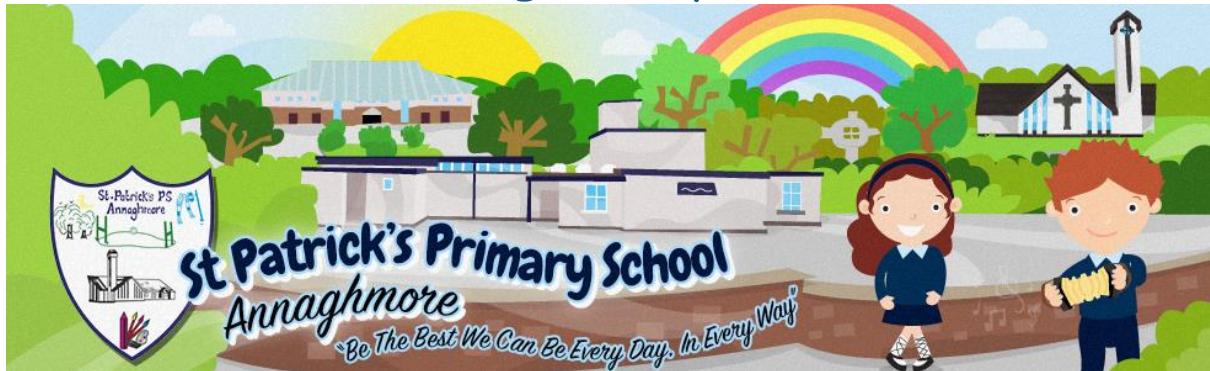

For those paying for school dinners, **the new cost is £3.10 per child per day, or £15.50 per week.**

- 👉 Please send the exact amount** in a clearly labelled envelope.

If you arrive late, please do not enter the school with your child. Wait with your child until the door is opened. Available staff will guide them to their classroom if required.

Punctuality

Punctuality is an important part of creating a calm, focused start to the school day. We ask that all pupils arrive by **9.05am**, to be ready for class at 9.10am, or come when the gates open at **8.50am** for outdoor play, so they are settled and ready for learning. During February, we will be working together to improve punctuality across the school. When children arrive late, it causes disruption to the class and interrupts learning routines, making it harder for pupils to begin their day positively. By ensuring that children are on time each morning, we help support their wellbeing, confidence, and overall progress. **Please make a good start to the month of February and arrive on time. Your cooperation on this matter is greatly appreciated.**

We also understand that, on occasions, unexpected matters arise, and children may have genuine reasons for being late. This is fully understood, and we appreciate your continued support in helping pupils arrive on time wherever possible.

Important Reminder – End-of-Day Collection

If someone **other than a parent or usual carer** is collecting your child, please inform the class teacher **in advance** by phoning the school or sending a written note. This is very important to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all pupils. Thank you for your cooperation.

Early Collection

We understand that, on occasion, children may need to be collected early from school to attend appointments or other commitments. To avoid disruption, we kindly ask that you call the school office or send a note to your child's class teacher in advance. Additionally, for child protection reasons, we request that parents remain in the porch area and do not enter the corridor when collecting children early. Thank you for your cooperation and support in helping us maintain a calm and safe environment for all pupils.
