Thursday 22 February 2024 - at 12 noon


EA Connect closes for online applications for Post Primary.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

From January, we are changing the protocol or rather returning to pre-COVID procedures regarding collecting a child early from school: this is to reflect the need for additional safety procedures to ensure anyone collecting a child in any class is a parent or is authorised by a child's parent to take their child out of school.

- **RING IN FROM THE CAR** and your child will be brought to the Secretary's Office for you to come into the school to collect.
- **Complete an official record slip that Lucille will have** stating the name of the child/ren being collected, PRINT your name date and sign the slip. Return the slip to Lucille for posting into the official record book.
- **If a parent is authorising someone else to collect their child/ren,** you must inform the office of who is authorised. Photographic ID should be carried by the person collecting your child so we can ensure they are the authorised person. Alternatively, Lucille can ring a parent to confirm who is collecting any child.
- **If you change the person collecting your child at their normal home time on any given day,** please make sure you notify the class teacher in Homework Diaries or by sending a brief note on the morning stating who is collecting your child.
